

Reaching the Ann Tribe — Sai Tun

Sai Tun uses the motorbike to reach Ann tribe. It takes 8 hours' drive in the muddy road to reach Ann village. This motorbike was provided by ACS. The Ann tribe is very superstitious and afraid of spirits. When he arrives in the village, he shares the Good News to the villagers in an open space. They are afraid that their evil spirits will flee away if he prays at their homes.

Sai Tun and his wife spend time teaching the children basic education. This makes the parents very happy. They give many gifts including vegetables, pumpkin, taro and sweet potatoes. This makes opening the door to share the Good News to their

homes easier. Formerly the children were prevented from all schooling because of fear of the evil spirits. Most children are not in school. Sai Tun said, "If Ann children are growing and developing in Christ, their parents and the whole tribe can accept Jesus. They can become Christians by forsaking worshipping evil spirits."

Sai Tun shares the Good News and prays for them. The Gospel has power and some villagers have now accepted Jesus as their Lord and Savior and been baptized in Christ.

Note: The Ann Tribe has a total population of 62,000 and these are among the first in the tribe to become Christians. The Tavoyan Tribe has 456,000 but only one tenth of one percent are known to be Christians. These are two of the last 50 unreached tribes to hear the gospel in Myanmar.

I'm currently sharing the gospel around Tachileik town especially to the unbelievers. I have been working as a Naga evangelist and a Naga Lecturer since 1988. I would like to request you to pray for the poor Naga Christians in Kachin state, at the Myanmar and India border. The Christian pastors always request you to pray for medical kits (helps) is very much needed. In brother LaVerne's time he sent help once in a year and it was very helpful and effective for the poor Naga Christians. There is no medical center in the Naga hill villages. Many have died. Now I'm trying to publish Tang Shang Naga hymnbooks for the Naga people. They still need help to print 1,000 books. Please pray also for my trip to Naga hill.

Steven Leme (1960-2022)

Dear all, This is the story of Steven Leme. He has been an Evangelist for 35 years. He persevered through many personal trials throughout his ministry. He has been supported by ACS for many of those years. He died in February of Covid-19.

Steven Leme was born at Yecho De, the other side of Mulashidi, Putao in 1960. His parents accepted Jesus as Savior after hearing the Good News from Morse family, forsaking animism and worshipping evil spirits.

He wanted to go new mission field to reach new tribes. Therefore, he went to PCBS (Putao Christian Bible School) and graduated in 1988. After graduation, he went to Nam San, Shan State to reach Lisu animists and planted a new church and delegated new

disciples and went to Pyi Oo Lwin to reach Nepali Hindus and planted a new church. Then he went to Phay Khun, Kaya State to reach Lisu animists. But he was detained by military and expelled from the village. In 1990, he came to meet LaVerne Morse and asked him to change his name from Job as he had been suffering like Job. LaVerne gave him a new name Steven.

After changing his name to Steven, it became worst. He was arrested by the brutal military by pointing guns at his head because of sharing the Good News to strong Buddhists. He was put underground without pillow or bed. Coke can is his pillow in the darkest room. The food is

mixed with rat pooh. No one knew where he was. After 45 days, he did not want to eat and took only a spoon after praying. Then he started getting vomiting and diarrhea and recovered. They put poison in food to kill him. But God save his life. Then God changed the military heart.

The next day, a military officer came to meet him at midnight and asked him "Do you want to go back?" He said, "Yes", and got agreement to come to the military camp daily and sign in for 3 months. He signed and they sent back home at midnight. He went to military camp daily and signed in for 3 months and then was totally released.

Steven become one of the leaders at Tachileit and coordinated with Tasanee and ACS to conduct the annual Golden Triangle Christian leadership seminar.

He got tuberculosis and Covid-19 and fell asleep in Christ on February 5, 2022. We are very

sad and conducted the best funeral service for 5 days and nights at his home and he was buried at Tachileit Christian Cemetery. Steven trained his children to be servants of God. We are happy that he has trained his son Paul to be a church planter and he planted a new church at Palian, Tachileit. His second son Ah Khi became a Christian musician and his daughter Ah Du become a Christian teacher.

Amy and May are supported by ACS and teaching there full time. They teach, tell Bible stories, singing praise songs, play games and have a fun time. In these photos, you can see the joy they have brought to these children.

My daughter Anna graduated from Bible College and teaches and visits children in multiple refugee camps. She went to assist Amy and May and took textbooks, teaching aids and cookies, purchased from special funds recently sent. Hope you will enjoy seeing the pictures. New Church Building at Refugee Camp

I am sending a report of planting a new church at a new refugee camp in the north. There are 530,000 refugees or Internally Displaced People in Myanmar as military coup took the power and bombed the villages. They have escaped into safe zone and are in many new IDP camps. ACS has helped with food and tarps for resettlement. Many of them received God's Love through us and planted a new church. Praise the Lord!

We have free lumbers, and the refugees are volunteers to build this church. We are building this church from the the contribution of **Bring Good News International**. The donation is building a 40 X 60 church building. The refugees are volunteers, giving free labor and saw the lumber to prepare church building. They are dedicated, leaving their huts, tarp tents and work the best for the church. The refugees are very poor but rich in spirit. They want to build the best house for the Lord to worship even though they are living in hut with tarp roof. We still need US \$1,500 for zinc roof sheets instead of tarps. Hope and pray that God will provide. Blessings. - **Simon**

The Keng Tung Church — Outreach in an Ancestor Worship Area

Ancestor worship has a long history in Asia. The people worship their ancestors who they have wronged as well as three other kinds of spirits: the forest spirits, the house spirits and the spirit of the destroyer. So, whenever a family member becomes sick or facing a misfortune, they have to offer sacrifices to the spirits. This makes them poorer, and they live in fear for all their lives. So, the ancestor worship is a bondage or curse for them. The Lisu evangelists, Peter, Robert and Silas have gone to them and are working hard to share the love of Christ to set them free from this fear and bondage.

The Keng Tung Church was started as a house church of former ancestor worshipers and has been growing. Robert's house has become too narrow for the house church members to have the worship service. Now the new building is almost complete. Praise the Lord!

February 14... Robert shared today that he will perform a wedding for a couple. They eloped and lived together without marriage vows before the Lord. Now they have come to know the will of God and the value of Christian Marriage because of their conversion. We also love to share good news that last

Because the cases of the pandemic are decreasing in the Putao Area, Bethany Theological College (Mularshidi Bible School) started again Dec 19. Tasanee Distributing Relief to Refugees

Financial Needs recently expressed by the workers...

- \$1500 for a tin roof on the new refugee church in North Myanmar
- \$2500 for a printing of 1000 Tang Shang Naga Hymnbooks
- \$2500 for medical kits (Includes first aid supplies and basic antibiotics, pain medicines, and stomach and intestinal medicines) for Naga evangelists
- \$1000 each for 3 motorcycles for 3 evangelists.

Ongoing Opportunities... We have church planters and students ready to go as we can support them.

- \$200 per month will support a church planter to go to an unreached tribe or area (That is \$2,400 per year.)
- \$100 per month will support a teacher in an IDP or refugee camp.
- \$40 per month will pay the full expense for student to attend Bible College to become a new church planter. (That is \$480 per year. The degree is a 4-year degree. One third of the time will be in field work learning how to do church planting.)

Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles.

And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. For the joy set before him he endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. Consider him who endured such opposition from sinners, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart.
